

MSMTA Elementary Distinguished Music Achievement Award

This award is for elementary school students and is designed to honor distinguished participation in MSMTA events accumulated during a student's 1st through 5th grades. This award will encourage and motivate the younger students to participate in our activities and continue their piano studies to reach their goal.

Deadlines: Documentation and application form may be sent at any time during the student's fifth grade, but no later than June 1, 2018. Plan at least one month from the time of application to receive the plaque.

Award: An engraved plaque with medallion from MSMTA. Plaques will be sent directly to the teacher for presentation to the student.

Requirements: A **fifth grade student** in the 2017-2018 school year must have earned at least **350** points from no fewer than **four** different MSMTA events listed on the application form during first through fifth grades only.

Participation in the following four events is required:

- (1) Keyboard Musicianship Exam* for two separate years – may earn up to 50 points each year.
- (2) Theory Test Program for two separate years – may earn up to 50 points each year.
- (3) Two separate performances in Local Association recitals or competitions –one per year; 30 points each.
- (4) A school or community music program involving one performance, instrumental or choral – 30 points.

Additional events may be any of MSMTA's other student activities as needed for points. In order to earn 350 points, student will need to participate in events more often than the minimum needed to qualify.

Eligibility: The MSMTA Elementary Distinguished Music Achievement Award is open to students of any instrument. Events entered and/or won during, but not prior to, the 2010-2011 academic year will qualify for this award. In the case of the Keyboard Musicianship and Theory, students may not duplicate levels or modules.

Application: Application form should be sent to the chair with photocopied documentation (i.e., critiques with the grade and signature of the judges, tests with scores, etc.) for all events. Do not send program listings. Documentation will not be returned.

Good	20 points
Fair	10 points

*If the student's instrument is other than the piano, participation in Strings Plus, String Solo, or the Chamber Music competition may be substituted for the Keyboard Musicianship Exam requirement.
